

- Douglas fir for the frame of the **TeaHouse**, including its posts, beams, joists and rafters.
- Redwood for the deck of the **TeaHouse**, including the floor boards and the kotatsu table.

In order to help preserve and protect these wooden parts, and to blend these two distinctive species of wood in a harmonious and pleasing way, the elements of the **TeaHouse** are stained with high quality stains from the Cabot company:

- Cabot's Clear Solution in "Pacific Redwood" for the Douglas fir frame.
- Cabot's Australian Timber Oil in "Mahogany Flame" for the Redwood floor boards.
